CSC Building Expo Chair's Message Bob Hartogsveld

The Ontario College of Trades (OCOT) is to disappear, to be replaced by an organization that will promote the skilled trades. The Provincial Government plans to Overhaul Bill 148 and dissolve OCOT. Ten trades were in the queue to make the case to expand the list of mandatory trades to include many of the common trades, including carpenters. The new government plans include:



- Set all journeyperson to apprentice ratios at one-to-one
- Implement a moratorium on trade classifications and reclassifications
- Initiate the winding down of the Ontario College of Trades

The government intends to develop a replacement model early in the New Year.

Gerrits recently opened up about his mental illness diagnosis and is working hard to change the way people think, removing the stigma and educating others
