


event will be Monday March 27th - topic is to be announced, but stay tuned.

I love catalogues; but where have they gone?

If you remember, I wrote an article back in 2012 about print catalogues where I expressed my interest in reading them and finding all sorts of information. Things have changed. I do not receive catalogues anymore in the mail and like most of you, I now receive online notices and newsletters.



Some information will fall short to spark your interest even if the information is vital. Even if I take a light approach to this topic, I know there are very serious efforts underway to get public reviews at the Canadian Standards Association. For instance, the public review of the new CSA Z7396.1-17 Medical gas pipeline systems draft standard is currently taking place. Even if this new CSA edition is being prepared in response from the medical gas stakeholders, anyone involved in the subject is welcome to take part in the review.

This Standard specifies safety requirements for pipelines for medical gases, medical vacuum, medical support gases, and anaesthetic gas scavenging systems in health care facilities, both public and private. It applies to all facilities providing health care services, regardless of type, size, location, or range of services. A similar public review of draft standard CSA Z317.5, Illumination design in health care facilities is now underway. This standard provides specific design criteria for illumination in various locations within a health care facility.

The presentation is an overall general introduction to stainless steel.

It addresses, at a high level, myths & truths about the product, brief history, the definition of stainless, chemistry (key elements), mechanical properties, contents of mill test certificates, major stainless groups, 300 series stainless (the common class of stainless), finishes, corrosion and selection factors.

Scott Haddy graduated from The University of Toronto with a B.Sc. (honors) in Health Sciences/Nuclear Physics and McMaster University - Engineering Department with a Metallurgy of Steel & Iron Certificate. He has been in the metals industry for almost 40 years during which time he progressed through Stelco Inc. ranks holding management positions in Cold Rolled Sheet, Tin Mill Products, Prefinished Sheet & Galvanized. He subsequently joined Continuous ColourCoat Inc. as VP of Sales as well as Regional Sales Manager - Coldmatic (now Kingspan).

He is currently am responsible for all Canadian operations at CFF Stainless Steels Inc. as well as Business Development. In this capacity, he is responsible for all aspects of OPS (personnel, equipment, quality, production, H&S, transportation), as well as technical training & support (internally & externally) and corporate legal matters.
