Dinner Meeting September 11, 2012

Electronic Leak Detection Methods for Locating Leaks in Waterproof Membranes *This Presentation qualifies for self-directed OAA Credits*

The failure to detect and correct membrane defects during and as soon as possible after installation can cause premature failure of the membrane. Problems include design deficiencies, faulty application of the membrane system and damage by subsequent trades. Roof designs incorporating a waterproof membrane under overburden such as a vegetative roof, insulation layer, wear-course, or topping slab greatly exacerbate the problem of leak locating

This presentation addresses the need for a systematic procedure to test, verify and monitor the integrity of waterproof membranes using electronic conductance measurement methods to locate leaks in exposed or covered waterproof membranes. The methods described are used on both conventional and protected roofs and are particularly useful for roof designs that incorporate a waterproofing membrane under a green roof, wearcourse or topping slab where direct inspection of the roof membrane is difficult or impossible.

This presentation is based on a new ASTM draft guideline describing electronic leak detection methods.

He graduated from the University of Manitoba with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Electrical Engineering in 1973, and a Master of Engineering Degree from the University of Manitoba in 1984. So you may ask, what's a Student Liaison Officer, and what role does the said person play in the grand scheme of things? Well in



Architectural Officer's Report: time to reach our Architectural Technology Students!

With summer just behind us and a busy new year commencing, I thought it would be an ideal opportunity to share with you some of my thoughts on what I have been proposing and what I have achieved in respect to reaching out to students in Architecture. Many of you may already know that I have been an accredited member of the Association of Architectural Technologists of Ontario (AATO) for more than a decade and served on

the Governing Council for six years. However, recently I also became an associate member of the Ontario Association of Applied Architectural Sciences (OAAAS) that shares some of the same goal as the AATO when it comes to educating college and university students in the advancement of a fulfilling career in architecture. My personal goal is to bring both the AATO and the OAAAS even closer together, with the hope of some kind of meaningful future affiliation for the benefit everyone.

During the AATO's 2013 Annual General Meeting held in the Blue Mountain Resort at the end of April, I pledged to form a new Committee, the Student Liaison Committee (SLC) and over the summer months I wrote a draft policy for the committee to be implemented this fall semester throughout the Ontario Colleges and Universities that have an approved Architectural Technology and Building Science Program.

The intention of the SLC policy is to ensure that the Student Liaison Officer is appointed by, and sits on Council in strict accordance with the AATO Act and Bylaws, something that has not happened in recent years. The objective, in short, is for each college or university to form their own AATO student liaison subcommittee, with each subcommittee electing their own chair; and having each of those chairs sit on the SLC. They will in turn, elect their Chair who will automatically become the twelfth AATO Councilor with full voting rights. The aim is for the Student Liaison to be the catalyst between the AATO and the Colleges and Universities to share, review and implement ideas and concerns that either party may have. That will ultimately improve the overall curriculum for the betterment of the profession as a whole. Although this AATO Student Liaison Program is a first step, it is something that I would be very keen to see be endorsed by other Associations and Organizations within the industry and in particular the OAAAS under the control of OAA. As I mentioned previously in this article, one of my personal goals (and opinion) is to see a much closer relationship between the AATO and OAAAS as I think both could benefit from each other. My belief is that many AATO members who

are fully Accredited Architectural Technologists would relish the opportunity to improve their qualifications and scope of work by taking advantage of the Licensed Technologist OAA model by taking the OAA Lecture Series and Entrance Examination with an exemption to all the prerequisites required for interns.

On the other hand, I also believe that the majority of Technologists OAAAS and Licensed Technologists OAA would love to see the word "Architectural" added to their designation but at present cannot because "Architectural Technologist" is a protected title that belongs to the AATO. However, if some form of a reciprocal membership arrangement, such as a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) were to be introduced, perhaps some serious benefits could be accomplished by both Associations. The MOU would allow Accredited Architectural Technologists AATO to achieve a higher level of credentials through the OAA program, and Technologists OAAAS and Licensed Technologists OAA to use "Architectural" to change their designation to Arch. Tech. OAAAS and Lic. Arch. Tech. OAA.

As I have said, this is only my personal opinion but I will be pressing both associations to consider these ideas so as to evaluate the benefits of membership for architectural technology students and the general public at large. This will help dispel the current confusion that exists.


