# USING DIVISION 01 TO BRIDGE THE GAP BETWEEN DIVISION 03 AND DIVISION 09

The American Concrete Institute recognizes that there are different tolerances associated with Division 03 and Division 09 floor flatness requirements. Concrete finishers are held to a quantitative (measured and repeatable) requirement and floor covering installers are held to a qualitative (visual assessment and non repeatable). A scientific calculation using highly accurate measuring equipment versus an informal assessment using age old methods, and this is causing misunderstandings and divisiveness on the project site, and a battle between separate components of the specification that the owner does not need, nor does it want to pay to resolve.

Join us to learn more about juggling the risk and aligning expectations to the entities best able to manage the risk components of the work.




# Member News and New Members Sylvie Dzikewich, CTR

The annual CSC conference will be held in Calgary in 2023!


