The Meeting was held on the day of March 27th virtually via Zoom

Roll call with representatives of all CSC Chapters present with the exception of Quebec City Chapter.

Membership:

Membership renewals ias of March 18th, 2021 are ahead of last year's. But membership are down about 6%. Mostly attributed to economic effect of the pandemic.

The London Chapter has gained one member over the last year and stand ata total of members, which is similar in size to Hamilton Niagara and Grand Valley, larger than Vancouver Island and Quebec City, and smaller than all other chapters.

Treasury:

Despite the pandemic, the association is on sound financial footing. The cancellation of the Montreal Conference only had minor net financial implications. Likewise the London Chapter's finances are healthy.

Elections:

An election is currently ongoing for the 4th Vice President. All members should have received an invitation to vote from Nick Franjic, Executive Director (through

<u>noreply@electionrunner.com</u>, a secure voting website). The ballots are due 16 April 2021.

Kevin Osbourne, CET Kelly Sawatsky, BA, RSW, CSP, LEED AP Tim Simpson


A link to he biographies have been included on the invitation to vote.

Stratigic Plan:

The board of directors are in the process of refreshing the Strategic Plan with an updated vison and mission statement. This is currently in translation.

Part of the Strategic Plan includes a number of initiatives to increase participation in educational programs and professional networking opportunities, to increase membership, and to increase access and sales of professional publications.

The first step was to redesign and enhance the website. That has now been completed and bugs have been fixed. The platform includes, easily edited home pages for each chapter within the website, and messaging via a dedicated twitter account for each chapter. An education portal within the webpage will be operational by September 2021.

Construction Canada Magazine has increasing it's presence on line with the introduction of 'Demo-cast', which are 20 minute on line presentations by manufacturers to an audience of CSC members and beyond.

These presentations reaches a broad targeted audience for manufacturers, and give consultants an opportunity to see products they may other wise not be familiar with.

These presentations are catching on both with the presenters and the audience as a viable alternative way of presenting products and services.

Chapter Events and Webinars

Education:

CSC courses are now offered on line by chapters either in a 5 day course format or a one evening per week format. If members are looking for opportunities to take the course there will be multiple avenues available for courses.

CSC has a central zoom account available for use by all chapters. So this is a perfect opportunity for Zoom gatherings within Chapters and across Chapters.

The PCD course has been fully adopted by three colleges to date as part of their curriculum in their architectural technologist programs.
