

A message from our **Chapter Chair**



WCA Activities for the month of April 2022

Construction Industry Update.

According to **Statistics Canada**, Manitoba building permit values YTD (Jan-Mar) for 2022 are equal to the same time period in 2021. In a change from recent trends, the residential sector, is having a slower start that the non-residential sector with an overall reduction in permit values of 14.2% YTD compared to 2021.

Non-Residential permit values for January to March 2022 are 27.9% higher than 2021 values. The primary driver of this change is the building permit for the Wawanesa building on 236 Carlton St. Industrial and Institutional permit values are down compared to last year at -24.6% and -50.3% respectively.

The **City of Winnipeg** permit report for March 2022 shows that non-residential construction sector permit values are 32% higher than last year, however this is highly skewed due to one large commercial project. Institutional and industrial permit values are down considerably compared to 2021. Residential Permit values are 19% behind 2021 values.

BuildWorks Canada.

In April 2022, WCA hosted 154 projects which is considerably less than the 5 year average (215). To the end of April, BuildWorks has hosted 725 compared to the 5 year average of 754. We currently have 147 projects closing in May.

BuildCast.

BUILDCAST is the WCA pre-bid information service which accumulates information on confirmed and potential projects to happen in Manitoba in the next 5 years. We are currently tracking 1053 projects potentially worth between \$17Bn and \$24.39Bn. WCA members receive a weekly update on new information on projects in the pipeline.

Advocacy/Government Relations.

Prompt Payment Legislation – Recent developments at the Manitoba legislature have made Prompt Payment closer to reality in Manitoba than ever before. Bill 28 (the *Prompt Payment for Construction Act*) was introduced in March. During the Bill's second reading Minister or Labour, Consumer Protection and Government Services Reg Helwer said the government will be doing further consultation on Prompt Payment before it progresses. This is a very positive approach taken by the Minister, and it has WCA's full support. **University of Manitoba Pre-Qualification Process** – The new Pre-Qualification process has been released and the RFPQ will be available after May 10. WCA will be hosting a webinar on May 26 providing information to members on this process.

Construction Material Price and Supply Volatility – WCA hosted a webinar with perspective from General Contractors, Trade Contractors, Suppliers and Owners exchanging ideas and techniques to manage material price risk.

Construction Industry Wages Act - Draft regulations are out and available for comment. These

regulations establish minimum wages for trades in the ICI and Heavy Civil construction sectors. They are available for comment until June 6.

Education.

The May line-up of courses is a combination of live, online courses and in-person courses at the WCA. There is something for everyone, with topics ranging from supervisor skills, project management, building code and contracts.

The **CSC Specifier (SP)** course is a comprehensive overview of the construction specification profession in Canada. At the completion of the course, students will have a solid grasp of a specifier's role, legal issues including contracts, bidding and disputes, writing style used in the profession and how to close out a project. The CSC Specifier course continues from where the PCD course ends and is a more in-depth education on the special techniques and skills required to write the procurement and contractual requirements of: Division 00; the administrative, procedural and temporary requirements of Division 01; and the technical specifications of Divisions 02 – 49.Completion of this course is mandatory in the process of becoming a Certified Specification Practitioner (CSP), or a Registered Specification Writer (RSW).

The **Technical Representative (TR)** course will provide a better understanding of contract documents and bidding procedures, product representation, professionalism, and ethics, and will provide a new depth of understanding and explanation of concepts beyond what was previously introduced in the PCD course. The course is designed for the individual involved in the supply section of the construction industry such as manufacturer representatives, agents or distributors of products. The student will have successfully completed the PCD course. This course is a requirement for the Certified Technical Representative (CTR) designation.

The **Construction Contract Administrator (CCA)** course is designed for those individuals involved in construction administration, including Contract Administrators, Property Managers, Architects, Engineers, Interior Designers, Specification Consultants, Building Authorities, and Bonding and Insurance Agencies. This course is a requirement for the Certified Construction Contract Administrator (CCCA) designation. s
