The CSC London Chapter had the pleasure of a private tour of the New Fanshawe College Downtown London Campus at 130 Dundas

Street lead by Denise Luksys & Jay Dillman of Fanshawe College. After a great reception & meal at "The Chef's Table" prepared by the students of the Culinary Program. The tour began in the restaurant where it was pointed out the existing tin ceiling was re-purposed within the restaurant public space, for all

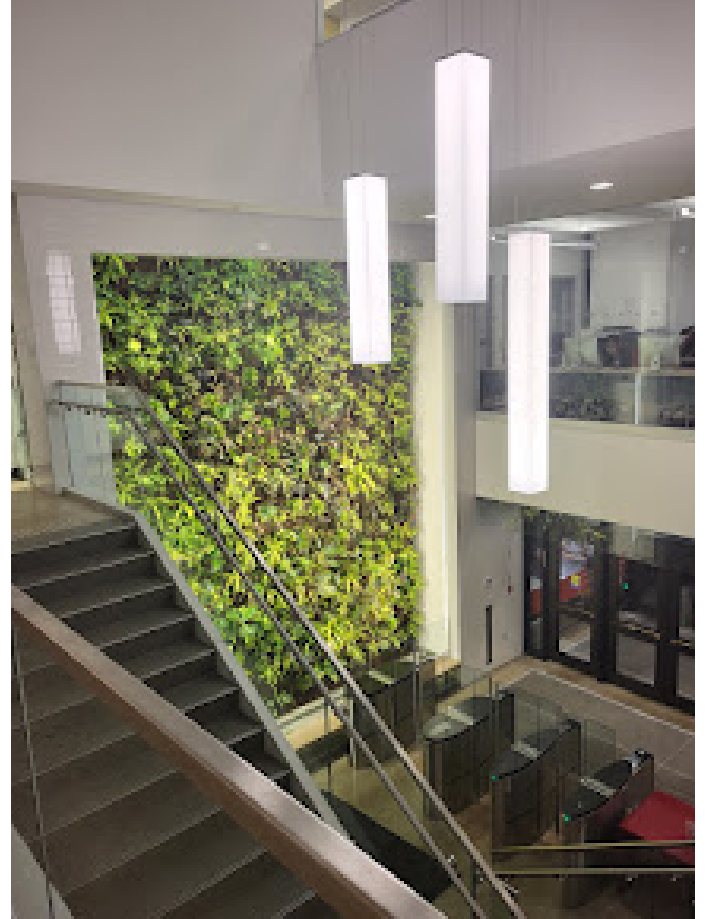


guest to enjoy. The tour then moved to the exterior to review the exterior façade along Dundas Street. The many features of the façade of the Old “Kingsmill’s Department Store” as considered heritage. So was required to be meticulously catalogued and rebuilt per the London Heritage Committee requirements. From the original yellow brick repurposed sporadically throughout the facility (main and second floor party walls and within restaurant, ect.), or from the little things like the Fanshawe signage hung above the sidewalk just as the Kingsmill’s sign did for 148 years.

We then made our way thru the building where there are multiple relic’s from the Kingsmill’s store still there today. Such as the old Kingsmill’s safe that is nestled under the stair, or pneumatic tube system that was used to exchange sales bills on display and functioning on the ground floor. There are multiple labs on the culinary floors with state of the art cooking equipment to enhance the teaching experience. It was very well informed how each of the departments had to work together to get a building and program that would work so efficiently together.... Very well done

I have to say the mixology class that was running during our tour was looking very interesting.

To conclude, for those of you that are wondering, yes the original Kingsmill’s elevator was salvaged and is used as the change room of the apparel store on the ground floor. We would like to thank Fanshawe College for allowing us to tour this beautiful state of the art facility, and maintaining the history of the Kingsmill’s store in the downtown core.
