This event was held on November 24<sup>th</sup> at the old Kellogg's Plant called the Factory on 100 Kellogg Ln in London, Ontario.

The focus of the Connections Café was to showcase the latest products and services in the construction industry.

Planning for the event got started after our London Chapter meeting held on the first week of October with our Director Jeff Halashewski taking the lead and talking the Hamilton Niagara Chapter to come on board with this adventure.

Jeff H and Stan Bury (Chapter Chair for H-N Chapter) organized their local chapters to reach out to vendors that would be interested in participating in this event.

With the time allotted after pulling the trigger on the event we had just over 4 weeks to push the event... and we did have some people say this will be a flop... Jeff with his enthusiasm pushed forward saying even if we get 5 sponsors we have a win with a potential 50 people.... but with much encouragement by the London Director we sold out the venue with 22 sponsors two weeks before the event.

Each vendor had the 8 invitations for up to two product representatives and 6 attendees Each of the chapter organizers encouraged the vendors to invite the chapter members as well as local architects, engineers, technologist, professors, students, Authorities having jurisdiction, and construction industry proprietors.

Of the potential 180 people a final invited total was at 128 people. Of the 128 people invited by the vendors 91+ people attended the event.

As part of the event we encourage attendees to visit each vendor with a passport which was used in a door prize draw at the end of the event.

Prizes included an Apple Watch, a foursome round of virtual golf (at the Factory) and a Christmas ugly sweater.

There were also a few vendors who had draws of their own which was a big hit with the crowd. Jeff Halashewski won the Draw from Skyline Group where he received a Yeti cooler!

As part of the London Chapter executive, I made it a point to visited each vendor to look at the vendor products and services.

I also discussed with each vendor how they found the event and if they had attendees stop by to talk with them about their products and services. 
