

MANITOBA BUILDING PERMITS December 2024

According to Statistics Canada, Building Permit numbers through December 2024 were up more than 12% compared to 2023. Please note these numbers should not yet be considered "final" for the year, slight adjustments will come over the next two months. Commercial building permits were up 14% compared to 2023, while Institutional building permits were up more than 13% and Industrial permits increased by 90%. The non-residential side as a whole was up more than 26% compared to last year. Residential permits in 2024 were up about two per cent compared to 2023. Multiple Residential permits decreased by more than three per cent, while Single-Family Residential permits were up about 10% compared to last year


