
I am looking forward to seeing everyone at the 2025 CSC conference

#### UPDATE FROM THE TREASURER

For those who may not be aware, March 31, 2025, marked the end of the Toronto Chapter's fiscal year. As of April 1, 2025, we have officially entered the 2025–2026 fiscal year.

The past fiscal year was relatively smooth and profitable for the Chapter. Unaudited financial statements outlining the Executive Committee's revenue and expenses—managed on your behalf—will be available at the Annual Chapter Meeting (ACM), scheduled for Wednesday, May 14, 2025, at the Toronto Cricket, Curling and Skating Club.



If you're unable to attend the ACM, rest assured that during the past fiscal year, the Chapter's financial assets were securely invested in term deposits with both TD Canada Trust and the Bank of Nova Scotia, which yielded strong returns.

A similar investment strategy is being carried forward into the new fiscal year, although interest rates offered by the banks are slightly lower than in previous years.

That concludes with the financial overview. I'd also like to reaffirm the Executive Committee's continued commitment to offering valuable programs throughout the fiscal year for both new and longstanding CSC members.

Programs offered this past year included our three educational streams (TR, CCCA, RSW), monthly dinner meetings, sponsorship programs, the annual golf tournament, social events, and the Building Expo trade show—just to name a few. Some of these initiatives generate revenue, while others are either fully funded or subsidized to benefit our members.

At the start of each fiscal year, every Chapter Executive sets a programspecific expense budget. This year, the Executive has remained largely within budget, with only minor adjustments across programs.

As Treasurer, my role—though not always popular—is to safeguard the Chapter's investments and cash reserves, while remaining open to financially supporting new, revenue-generating initiatives. To support this, I will be asking each Executive to project potential revenue for their programs based on previous years' performance.

Thank you for placing your trust in me, the Executive Committee, and our accounting firm, HFPC, for both the past and present fiscal years.
