Jeff Halaschewski opened the session with a forward-looking discussion on **AI in Construction Documents**. His presentation explored how artificial intelligence is reshaping research, drafting, and quality control within specifications, while emphasizing the ethics, accountability, and human judgment required to use these tools responsibly. Jeff challenged attendees to think about how AI can elevate—not replace—the expertise of specifiers and designers.

Next, Alex Grames delivered a timely and informative session on **radon mitigation**, highlighting evolving best practices, regulatory requirements, and the growing need to integrate proactive mitigation strategies into design and construction. His talk reinforced the critical role our profession plays in ensuring
